WELCOME TO THE SIMON JONES BIRTHDAY PARTY!

This event has been organised to celebrate what would have been Simon Jones's 27th birthday and to protest at the complete lack of action over his death. It is over two years since Simon was killed on his first day at work doing an extremely dangerous job that he had no experience or training for. Earlier this year MPs of all parties signed a motion demanding action over Simon's death. Five months ago the High Court roundly condemned the Crown Prosecution Service for its "barmy" decision not to prosecute.

But these things mean nothing to a government determined to cover up the human cost of casualisation. Simon's death would have been wiped under the carpet like so many others if it had not been for the direct action taken by his family and friends. We know that the only way we will see justice for Simon is by continuing to take to the streets to demand it.

You are asked to behave in a way that respects Simon's memory. It has been agreed that there will be no drinking or violence at this event. If you are drinking you will be asked to leave .

IF YOU ARE ARRESTED

- 1. The only information you should give the police is your name, address and date of birth. The police may ask other questions, tell you to fill in forms, attempt to intimidate you or try to involve you in 'friendly' conversation don't cooperate with any of it, as doing so simply helps the police gather more information about you and others.
- 2. **Ask to speak to a solicitor right away.** A solicitor, Sadiq Khan of Christian Fischer, will be available on 0207 831 1750 all day. If you don't have a solicitor of your own ask the police to phone this number to get you a solicitor.
- 3. Try to remember as much about your arrest as possible. Write it down as soon as you can. You are entitled to writing equipment in custody, but rarely get it. Ask that your request for writing material is noted on your custody record.
- 4. If the police charge you they can fingerprint you, by force if necessary. The police have no right to take your photograph even if you are charged and you should refuse to have it taken. If you are forced, demand that your refusal is noted on your custody record.
- 5. Being arrested, especially for the first time, can be an intimidating experience. That is because it is meant to be. But remember you are not alone. All the time you are inside, people are working to get you out.
